

What are our options when everything is changing?



Dense cities require dense forms of transportation, which are customer centric through seamless connection

Demand for Mobility: more density




Supply of Mobility: seamless mobility







For Amsterdam, this requires smart expansions of the network, creating fast connections and flexible options





Stations should offer fast and easy transfer between new and existing modes, but they can be much more

- Fast and easy pedestrian routes (how much time do you lose walking?)
- Space for bikes and bike rental
- Taxi space and integrated Uber
- Charging stations for electric car share
- Parcel machines and quality retail
- Give the sense of luxury airports









Combining different modes of transportation in one travel planner is the first step to helping consumers







Payment integration is the next step, in Netherlands we already have an all transport chipcard and are now bringing this functionality to mobile
